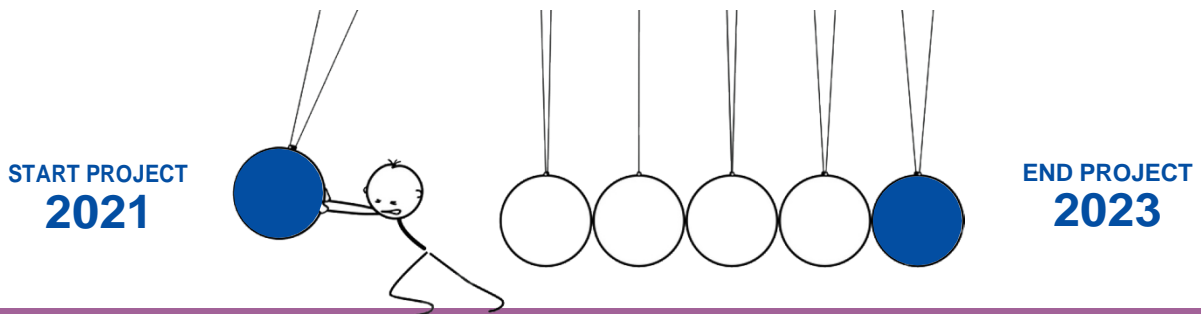

1 INTRO

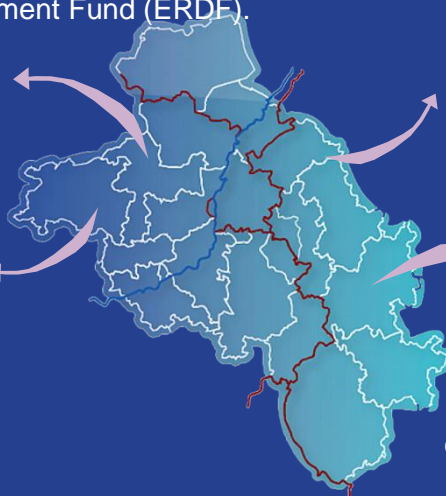
This project received 2.159.739,67 EUR funding of which 1.079.869,63 EUR were granted by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF).

1 in 10 patients in hospital care is affected by adverse events (de Vries et al., 2008)

More than **50%** of harm is preventable. (Panagioti et al., 2019)

COMPAS enhances **patient safety and resilience** through comprehensive multiprofessional education in the EMR

The COMPAS project has developed **interprofessional educational** modules aiming to equip healthcare professionals with **knowledge and skills to enhance patient safety and resilience.**

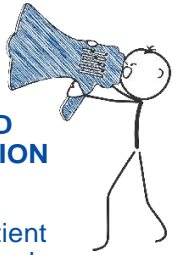
MAINTENANCE OF RESILIENT AND WELL-EQUIPPED HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS

COMPAS provides resources, training, and support to enhance the resilience of healthcare professionals in the EMR.

STRENGTHENED COLLABORATION



Recognizing that patient safety is a shared responsibility, COMPAS promotes interprofessional and cross-border collaboration.

This involves enhancing communication and teamwork among healthcare professionals, and thereby improving patient safety.

3 main results:



1. Blueprint for Multiprofessional Patient Safety Education

The blueprint serves as a guide for structured continuing patient safety education, promoting comprehension between different educational activities in the EMR.



2. Training to Foster Patient Safety and Resilience

COMPAS trainings are designed to be widely accessible, providing healthcare professionals with the necessary knowledge, skills and attitude to enhance patient safety and build healthcare professionals' resilience in a challenging working environment.

Key milestones



07/03/2022: During the kick-off event held at the Center for Teaching and Training in Aachen, key stakeholders were introduced, partnerships and consortium agreements were established, and an advisory board was formed to provide strategic guidance throughout the project



25/11/2022: Data collection on a comprehensive state and needs analysis on patient safety and resilience among healthcare professionals and students in the Euregio Meuse-Rhine was successfully finalized



26-30/08/2023: The consortium participated in the AMEE conference in Glasgow, presenting project results and actively engaging in dissemination efforts to raise awareness within the professional community



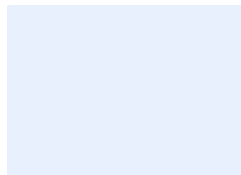
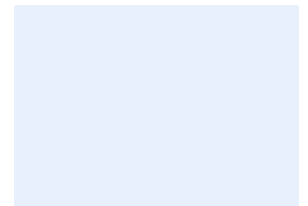
22/11/2023: The final symposium took place at the Invention Center in Aachen, providing a platform to showcase outcomes from the needs analysis, project results, and pilot studies
